TOPIC: COUNCIL HONORARIUM

Definition:

An honorarium is a monetary award given for the voluntary services of a council member in recognition of the significant contribution of time and effort provided by the member. While no honorarium could reflect the volume or quality of contributions, it is a small measure of recognition and thanks.

Who Qualifies:

All Council members including public representatives, who attend at least 60% of the scheduled Council meetings and 60% of any Committee meetings upon which they are members, are eligible.

Amount:

The Council Chairperson will receive twice the amount of the Active Practice registration fee. Co-chairs would receive 1.5 times the Active Practice registration fee. Other Council members including public representatives will receive an honorarium in the amount of the Active Practice registration fee.

When:

The honorarium will be distributed after the Annual General Meeting.

Note:

Council members are also eligible to receive reimbursement for expenses accrued as a result of acting on behalf of the College. Expenses are reimbursed separately from the Honorarium, according to Policy Number 8.26 Expense Policy.
