

Constraint Induced Movement Therapy Workshop

This full day workshop at Riverview Health Centre will provide an opportunity for Physiotherapists and Occupational Therapists who regularly work with stroke survivors from across the continuum of care to develop a comprehensive understanding of Constraint-Induced Movement Therapy (CIMT).

CIMT is a therapeutic package of interventions designed to treat the upper limb dysfunction experienced by some individuals living with the effects of a stroke. At the conclusion of the workshop participants will:

- 1) appreciate the components of the CIMT intervention
- 2) understand the breadth of evidence examining CIMT
- 3) identify clients who would benefit from this approach
- 4) understand the issues relevant to its implementation in practice
- 5) develop strategies that may be used to implement CIMT in practice.

The workshop is a mixture of lecture and small group activities. The day is designed to promote competence in clinical skills related to treating patients who have suffered a stroke as well as provide networking opportunities with other therapists treating the same patient population.

There is no cost to attend this workshop, however registration is limited to 25. The registration deadline is September 17, 2010.
