3.11 Membership In Good Standing

Purpose:

This policy clarifies the definition of membership in good standing required by the College of Physiotherapists of Manitoba (CPM), and is consistent with *The Physiotherapists Act* and Regulations 4 (1)(a)(f).

Policy:

- The Council considers proof of membership in good standing to be: A declaration by the last two physiotherapy regulatory bodies with which an applicant was most recently registered (if applicable). The declaration attests to the fact that the applicant was registered for a period of time and during that time, was or was not the subject of an investigation or disciplinary action. The declaration also covers pending investigations. A professional association is not considered to be a regulatory body.

Procedure:

The applicant will be required:

1. To sign an agreement to authorize the previous or current regulatory body to release the requested information.

The information must be provided by an official from the regulatory college. The document must be signed, sealed and dated; and must be provided directly to CPM from the sending regulatory body.
