3.8 Approved Entry-to-Practice Examination

Purpose:

1. To identify the Council approved entry-to-practice examination for licensure with the College of Physiotherapists of Manitoba (CPM)
2. To state the required documents accepted by CPM

Policy:

The Council of the College of Physiotherapists of Manitoba (CPM) has approved the Physiotherapy Competency Examination (PCE) offered through the Canadian Alliance of Physiotherapy Regulators (CAPR) as the entry to practice exam for licensure in Manitoba. The PCE has two components. The Written Component (Qualifying Exam) and the Clinical Component (Physiotherapy National Exam).

In absence of the Clinical Component of the Physiotherapy National Exam, in June 2022, CPM Council approved successful completion of the CPM Practice Based Competency Assessment (PBCA) as the clinical evaluation required for Examination Candidates to convert to the Active Practice register.

Verification of successful completion of the Written Component (Qualifying Exam) is required in order for the candidate to register as an Examination Candidate with CPM and work under supervised practice until eligible for the PBCA.

Applicants for registration must complete a Verification Request Form (VRF) with CAPR requesting their results be submitted to CPM to confirm successful completion of either or both parts of the PCE.
